We recommend that MMRCL consider alternate lower cost, but equally effective, options for single journey tickets such as QR codes. These QR codes can easily be dispensed at TVM or TOM as printed codes that do not need to be collected back and recirculated. Also, these QR codes can easily be made available on Smart Phones via a Mobile App or Web application. This will enhance the customer experience greatly while lowering Capital and Operational costs for MMRCL. We will be happy to share with MMRCL (at an appropriate time) details on how the QR code option can be implemented in a secure fashion.
